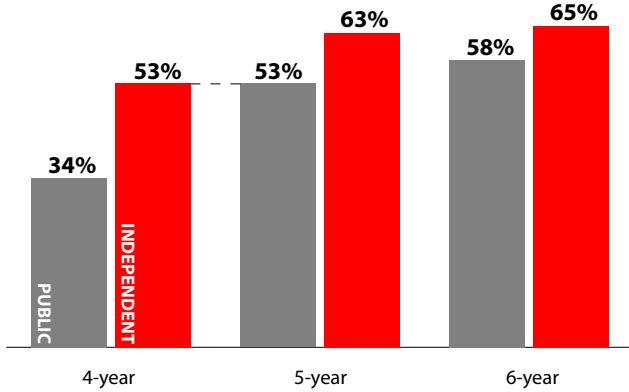


# Greatest Hits from AICUO's Graph of the Week

## Baccalaureate Graduation Rates Ohio Public Main Campuses and 4-Year Independents Cohort Entering Fall 2006

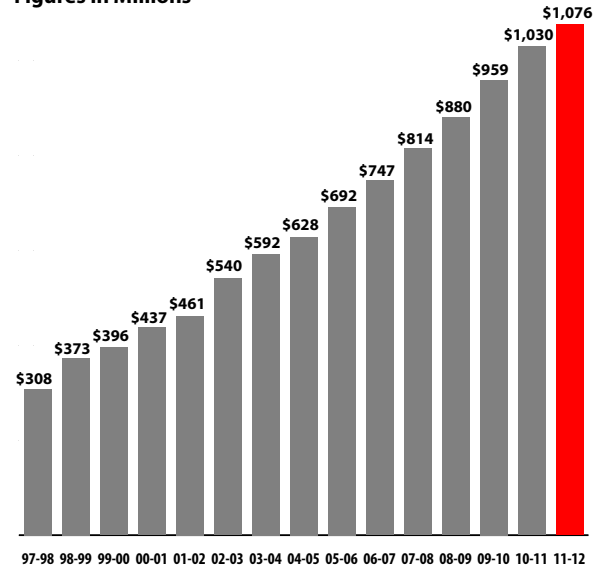

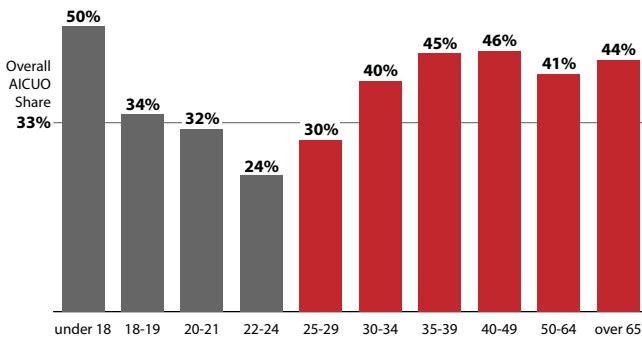

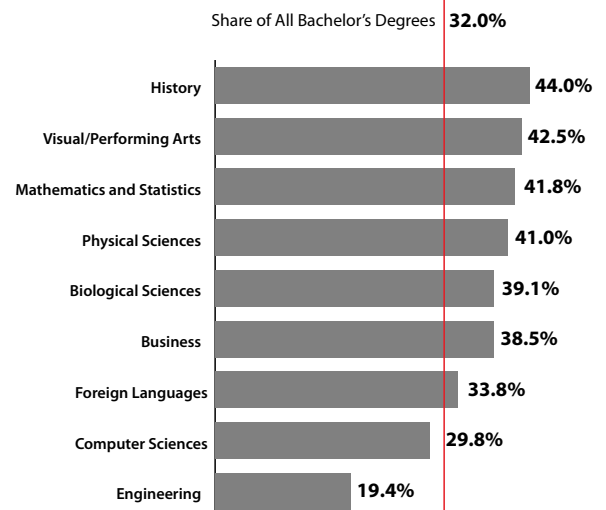
Ohio's independent colleges now annually award more than \$1 billion in student grants and scholarships from their own resources, representing 82 percent of all such aid received by their students.

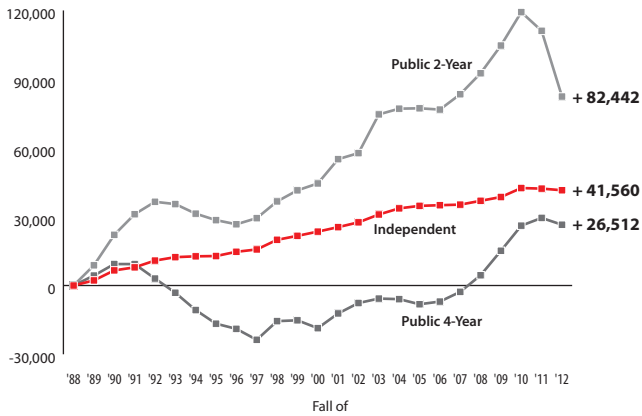

Federal data on graduations shows the disproportionate production of independent colleges in producing degrees in areas critical to the future of Ohio.

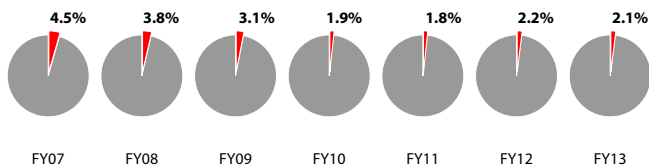
**Cumulative Change in Fall Headcount Enrollment

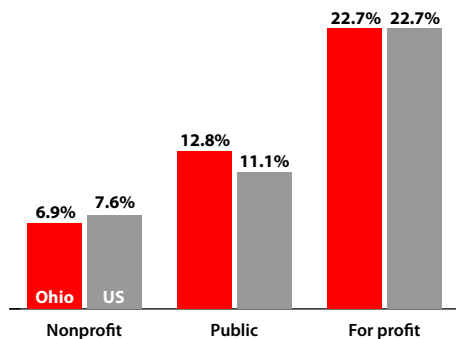
To varying degrees, both public and nonprofit higher education sectors in Ohio lost enrollment this fall.

Although the independent sector's share of the state's college and university students has remained at just above one fifth, its share of Ohio's higher education funding has been eviscerated.

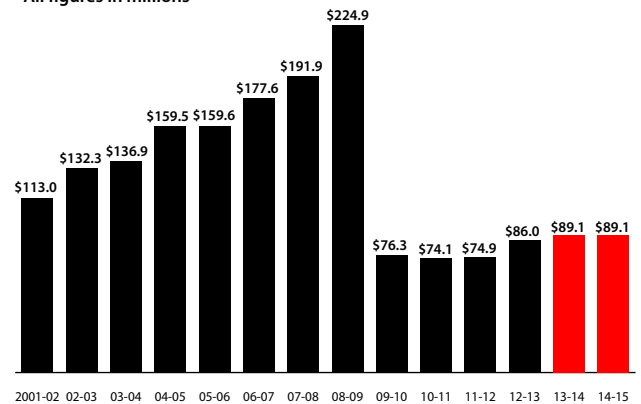
**3-Year Cohort Default Rates

Academic Years 2001-02 to 2014-15**

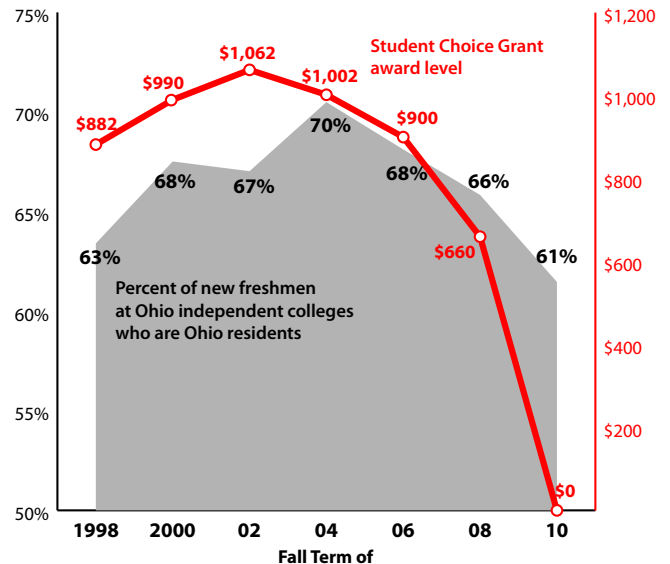

The repeal four years ago of the Student Choice Grant, which supported Ohioans attending in-state independent colleges, eliminated a key incentive for students to stay in their home state for their education.
